Standards of Excellence



The material listed below will help each choir member to know and understand the expectation and responsibilities for SUCCESS.

- Develop and maintain sight-reading skills.
- ☐ Perform at all major Concerts: Fall Concert, Winter/Holiday Concert, Spring Concert (UIL Showcase), Senior Pop Show.
- □ Participate in the major Contest of the year: UIL Concert & Sightreading
- Maintain good school attendance.
- Maintain eligibility.
- Develop excellent daily rehearsal skills, both in and outside of class.
- □ Participate in choir social activities.

CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT RULES

The following classroom behavior is necessary to ensure productive and effective rehearsals and to create a positive and structured learning environment.

- 1. Be seated with music folder and pencil ready to sing when the bell rings.
 - Many instructions and procedures are covered at the beginning of class.
 - The better prepared everyone is, the more we get done as a group during rehearsals.
- 2. No talking when the director is speaking to the class or working with individual sections.
 - Social talking is a distraction that prevents others from learning.
- 3. Follow instructions the first time they are given.
 - Arguing with or talking back to the teacher is breaking this rule.
 - Not getting started immediately on the assigned task is breaking this rule.
- 4. Respect others, the teacher, and yourself.
 - Positive attitudes lead to success.

Consequences

- 1. First infraction Warning
- 2. Second infraction Discipline referral write-up and student-teacher conference. Parents will be notified.
- 3. Third infraction Discipline referral write-up and parent conference.
- 4. Fourth infraction Student may be asked to leave the Choral Department.

CHOIR GRADING POLICY

There are five major categories used to determine grades:

- A. Class Preparation
- B. Rehearsal technique
- C. Singing and written tests
- D. Evening/after-school rehearsals
- E. Attendance at major performances

A. Class Preparation: (10%)

- 1. Each day students will receive five points in the following areas:
 - a. Being in class on time with music and pencil
 - b. Demonstrating proper vocal technique
 - c. Sight-reading
 - d. Attitude/focus
- 2. Students can receive up to 25 points each week. The student's total is averaged with the teacher's total for the final preparation grade.

B. Rehearsal technique: (20%)

- 1. Students will come to class with a good attitude and sing to the best of their ability.
- 2. Students will sight-read and sing on a daily basis.
- 3. Students will not talk when conductor is on the podium or working with an individual group.
- 4. Students will treat each other with respect.

C. Singing and written assignments: (10%)

- 1. Students will have at least three assignments over the course of the semester: 2 singing tests (1 before each concert) and theory assignments.
- 2. The total number of points per assignment will be determined by the director and will not exceed 150 points.
- 3. Students who do not pass singing tests will **not** be allowed to perform in concerts.

D. Evening/after-school rehearsals: (15%)

- 1. Chorale members have a weekly rehearsal on Monday nights from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Students who do not attend Monday rehearsals will NOT be allowed to perform in concerts or at festivals.
- 2. Cantamus, Belle Ensemble, & Belle Voci members have rehearsals on Thursday afternoons from 4:20-5:20 for four to six weeks before concerts. Cantamus members will have after-school camp 1-2 times per semester. Students who do not attend after-school rehearsals will NOT be allowed to perform in concerts or at festivals.



E. Attendance at major performances: (45%)

By enrolling in choir, students are committing to attending all required events during the year. This includes <u>after-school rehearsals</u>, <u>concerts</u>, and <u>contests</u>. Certain types of absences can be made up. Each case will be considered individually and privately according to its circumstances. All decisions are made at the director's discretion and are final. You MUST notify Ms. Solberg or Mr. Weldon by email at least **TWO WEEKS** prior to your conflict in order for an absence to be considered!

Students may make up an excused absence IF:

- 1) The absence is due to the student's own illness or death in the family.
- 2) The absence is due to a conflict with another Bellaire class or sporting event. Club sports are <u>NOT</u> excused. Please notify the directors by email at least **2 WEEKS** prior to your event so we can work out the conflict with the other teacher(s) involved.
- 3) The absence is due to a conflict with a religious holiday.

Students are considered UNEXCUSED if the absence is due to a "non-Bellaire" event, doctor's appointment, not having a ride, simply forgetting about the event, or not notifying the directors in a timely fashion.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES RECEIVE A ZERO FOR THE EVENT.

In the event of an illness on the event day, it is the parents' and student's responsibility to provide written documentation to the directors the day after the performance. An alternative assignment will be given and points awarded at the discretion of the directors.


- 1. There are 3-4 performances each semester. The majority are at BHS while some are off-campus. Failure to attend <u>any of these</u> will result in a loss of 200 points per performance. Please note that this is at least one letter grade.
- 2. Students must pass their pre-concert voice test in order to perform. This includes UIL. Students who do not pass will not receive credit for the concert. Live performances are a requirement of both the class and to satisfy the TEKS, which is a TEA Fine Arts mandate.

Choir Supplies



- ◆ **Choir binder** Two options: Purchase one from the school for \$2. OR go buy one on your own. <u>Must be 1-inch, black, view binder.</u> NO EXCEPTIONS!
- ♦ **Sharpened pencil** Kept in the choir binder AT ALL TIMES.
- ◆ **Music** provided by the school.

Students are responsible to care for and maintain the quality of the music and to return it in its original condition. Any lost or damaged materials will be replaced by the student.

WHAT EVERY CONCERT CHORALE STUDENT & PARENT SHOULD KNOW

Congratulations! You and your son/daughter have either been chosen or are returning to a select group of students called Chorale. Chorale is the award-winning varsity choir. Every student in the choral program has the opportunity to audition for Chorale. However, only those students that are vocally ready, dependable, goal-oriented, academically stable, and devoted enough to give time and effort are selected. To achieve the standards and goals that are a tradition of this organization, each member and parent will be expected to be active, dependable and consistently contributing their efforts to the organization. The following facts and expectations should be discussed so that each member begins the year with the same understanding.

Chorale is a University Interscholastic League class. This means that both outside-of-school and classroom rehearsal time is utilized. **Chorale members have a required, scheduled rehearsal every Monday between 5:30 - 7:30 p.m.** Monday rehearsals do not include student holidays. These rehearsals are used for any project we are working on throughout the school year. All working students should arrange for Monday nights off from 5:00 - 8:00 p.m. All members are required to participate in every activity, such as fundraisers and extra performances. Parents are encouraged to avoid scheduling conflicts for the students whenever possible.

All new Chorale members will be on a probationary status for one year and will be re-evaluated at semester and year-end to determine continuation in Chorale. All Chorale members can be reauditioned and evaluated at the Director's discretion. All members are expected to be at **ALL REHEARSALS AND ALL PERFORMANCES** on time unless the Director is notified in advance of the absence. One unexcused absence from a performance will result in a conference to determine the advisability of remaining in the choir program. Two tardies to rehearsals or performances will be reviewed as to the student's ability to participate properly. This can be reflected in the student's grade as well as removal from the group. The responsibility for communicating absences/tardies and the reasons for them is the responsibility of the student. He/she must tell the director ahead of time so that details may be worked out.

Please understand that these high standards are not meant to be a burden on the student or parents. Instead, they are put in place to ensure the best possible education for all students and to build on the reputation of Bellaire High School and the Fine Arts Department. There is no limit as to what we can achieve if we all work together!



THE FIRST CHORALE EVENING REHEARSAL IS MONDAY, AUGUST 30

CHORALE BREAK DOWN

Q: When does Chorale rehearse?

A: During the regular school day & every Monday night 5:30-7:30 p.m.

A: If you have a required Bellaire function – e.g. game – you must speak to me as soon as possible. **Religious holidays are excused without penalty.** Other Bellaire classes – e.g. yearbook, debate, theater, band – are handled on a case-by-case basis.

Q: What absence will NOT be excused?

A: Club sports or events; work.

Q: When does Chorale perform?

Q: Do grades matter for Chorale members?

A: YES! Besides the obvious fact that you would like to graduate from high school, choir members cannot perform at UIL Solo & Ensemble, on trips, or compete in All-State if they are ineligible.

Q: Do I have to audition for All-State or take voice lessons to be in Chorale?

A: No, but both of these programs are opportunities given to you to make you a more confident singer and a better musician.

Q: *Do I have to attend the trip?*

A: Chorale members <u>are expected</u> to attend the trip unless there is a serious personal matter. Please discuss this with the choir director.

Congratulations! You and your student have either been chosen or are returning to Cantamus Treble Choir. Cantamus is an award-winning intermediate non-varsity choir. Every student at Bellaire has the opportunity to audition for Cantamus. However, only those students that are show a strong desire to be in the choral program and musical promise are selected. To achieve the standards and goals that are a tradition of this organization, each member and parent will be expected to be active, dependable and consistently contributing their efforts to the organization. The following facts and expectations should be discussed so that each member begins the year with the same understanding.

Cantamus is a University Interscholastic League class. This means that both outside-of-school and classroom rehearsal time is utilized. Cantamus members have 1-2 after-school camps each semester. These are required rehearsals with a guest clinician and occur on Fridays. Camp runs from 4:20-6:20. Cantamus members also have a required, scheduled rehearsal Tuesday or Thursday afternoons from 4:20-5:20 for at least one month before performances in which the classes combine for performances or contests. A schedule of these rehearsals will be handed out at least two weeks before they begin. Students should arrange for rides BEFORE rehearsals begin. Parents are encouraged to not schedule conflicts for the students (e.g. doctor's appointments, etc) whenever possible.

All members are expected to be at **ALL REHEARSALS AND ALL PERFORMANCES** on time unless the Director is notified in advance of the absence. One unexcused absence from a performance will result in a conference to determine the advisability of remaining in the choir program. Two tardies to rehearsals or performances will be reviewed as to the student's ability to participate properly. This can be reflected in the student's grade as well as removal from the group. The responsibility for communicating absences/tardies and the reasons for them is the responsibility of the student. She must tell the director ahead of time so that details may be worked out.

Description of Choir Performances

FALL

☐ FALL CONCERT

The Fall Concert is the premier performance of all choirs to our parents, friends, and community. This is a **mandatory**, **graded** event.

□ HOMECOMING

Chorale performs the anthem at one of the biggest games of the year. **Graded, mandatory.**

□ CABARET

Primarily a fundraiser for the Spring Trip, this is an evening of popular music performed by the choir. Dinner will be served by the choir while selected soloists and ensembles perform for our guests. This is a **mandatory**, **graded** event.

□ WINTER/HOLIDAY CONCERT

The second concert of the year, the Choirs combine with the Bellaire Orchestras for an evening of music to get you ready for winter break. A reception follows provided by the Friends of the Bellaire Choir and Bellaire Orchestra. This is a **mandatory**, **graded** event.

SPRING

□ SINGING VALENTINES

Singing Valentines are performed at BHS on (or as close to) Valentine's Day by **Chorale** members. While only Chorale performs, all choir members can and should sell valentines.

□ SPRING TRIP

This year's Spring Trip will be determined by the end of October as more information is available regarding Covid safety protocols While the trip is a lot of fun, it is also a performance for the choirs. Chorale members are required to attend. (Exceptions can be made for very special circumstances.) Please see pages 20 & 21 for more information and a listing of fundraising opportunities. A pre-trip meeting is **required** for all attending students and their parents.

J UIL SHOWCASE

This is the third concert of the year, held in March. Featured at this performance are students who received superior ratings on class I solos at the UIL Solo & Ensemble Festival. The choirs also perform the music to be sung at the UIL Concert & Sight-reading Contest in April. This is a **mandatory, graded** event.

□ PRE-UIL PERORMANCE & CLINIC

Concert Chorale, Chorale Women, and Chorale Men participate in a Pre-UIL performance & clinic in preparation for UIL. In addition to a written critiques, each choir takes part in a workshop. This is a **mandatory**, **graded** event.

■ UIL CONCERT & SIGHTREADING

The biggest competition of the year! Each choir performs three pieces and sight-reads before three distinguished judges. This event occurs during the school day. <u>This is a mandatory, graded event.</u> <u>Students who do not attend will NOT have a make-up assignment.</u>

Description of Choir Performances

SPRING (cont.)

□ POP SHOW DRESS REHEARSAL

The dress rehearsal for the Pop Show is a **required**, **graded** event. <u>Students must be present at the rehearsal to perform in the pop show.</u> The rehearsal is all day at BHS.

□ POP SHOW

This is the final concert of the year. All choirs learn and perform choreographed songs. For this performance, the choir members wear costumes usually requiring a minimal cost. While this concert features the seniors, it is also part of the curriculum and is therefore a **mandatory**, **graded** event.

Description of Choir Social Events

□ CHOIR KICK-OFF

This is a night of fun, fellowship, and food! The choir kick-off is the first social event of the year and a necessity for choir bonding. This is a required event for all choir members. The choir boosters provide pizza; students provide sides. **This is a mandatory, graded event.**

□ CANTAMUS CAMP

Cantamus Camp is a night of music and fun in preparation for the fall concert and the year as a whole. The choir will rehearse, have dinner, and get to know each other outside of the regular school day. The spring camp is to prepare for the UIL competition season. **These are mandatory, graded events. Cantamus officers may schedule an additional camp.**

□ CHORALE LOCK-IN

The lock-in is an overnight event in preparation for the UIL competition season. The choir rehearses Friday night and Saturday morning, as well as participates in team-building activities. **This is a mandatory, graded event.**

■ BELLE BASH

Belle Bash (for Belle Ensemble & Belle Voci) is a night of music and fun in preparation for the winter concert. The choir will rehearse, have dinner, and get to know each other outside of the regular school day. The spring Belle Bash is to prepare for the UIL competition season. **These are mandatory, graded events.**

■ BANQUET

The choir banquet is a fun night of food and fellowship. At the last social event of the year, students are presented with certificates and trophies honoring their participation in the Bellaire Choirs. Parents are encouraged to attend this formal dinner.

Description of Honor Opportunities

Madrigal Choir is a select group of 14-18 choir students. Singers must be currently enrolled in Chorale and have exhibited excellent choir skills and dedication. Rehearsals will occur 1-2 times a week after school and on some weekends. Madrigal Choir will perform at most concerts and contests, including the Madrigal Choir Festival in San Antonio. The choir is also responsible for improving public relations by performing at various middle schools, hospitals, and community centers.

□ ALL-STATE CHOIR

Any Bellaire Choir student can audition for one of three All-State Choirs. The All-State Choirs perform at the TMEA convention in San Antonio in February. Students are selected from all over Texas through a series of auditions: **District, Region, Pre-Area, and Area**. Students begin learning the music in the summer before school begins. Interested students should talk to the director in the spring. This is an extra-curricular event.

□ ALL-STATE DISTRICT AUDITIONS

The first stage in the All-State process. Fee of \$20. <u>Deadline</u>: September 6.

□ ALL-STATE REGION AUDITIONS

The second stage in the All-State process. Only students who have passed District participate in Region auditions.

□ REGION CHOIR

Region Weekend is a two-day rehearsal & performance for select students in the choral program. Students are selected for the Region Mixed and Treble choirs based on their Region Audition. The Region Honor Choir is made up of students chosen by the Director. It is open to freshmen and sophomore women and men in all grades. Fee of \$20. *Deadline: October 31*.

□ ALL-STATE PRE-AREA & AREA AUDITIONS

The third and fourth stages of the All-State process. Only students who qualify out of the previous rounds of auditions participate. In addition to performing the All-State music, students must also sight-read for these rounds.

■ UIL SOLO & ENSEMBLE

Solo & Ensemble contest is beneficial toward the continual vocal development of the each individual as well as the entire choral department. Students sing a solo and/or perform in an ensemble for a judge. The judge provides feedback and rating on a scale of I (superior) – V (poor). Students who receive a superior rating on a class I solo can perform on the UIL Showcase Concert and qualify for the State Contest in Austin which takes place in May. **Madrigal Choir** is required to participate in this event. Eligibility is required. Fee of \$10/solo; \$10/ for each member in an ensemble. Accompanist fee separate. *Deadline: December 6..*

This is only for students who qualify from the February contest. Accompanist fee of \$10.

SPRING TRIP

Each year the BHS Choir attends a music festival or competition outside the Houston area. This year we are not able to give a trip estimate until the end of October. We will not determine the location of the trip until we have more information about the status of the pandemic. Our two possibilities are San Antonio/Corpus Christi or New York City. Obviously, the cost of these two trips are vastly different. If we go to NYC, we will attend Broadway shows and experience the city. If we go to San Antonio, we will do an exchange performance with another choir and experience the city.

Each choir member will be excused from classes for the duration of the trip. Each choir member is responsible for earning his/her share of the trip cost. Students are given the opportunity to participate in fund-raising activities during the year to earn money to pay the individual cost. Parents are encouraged to chaperone the trip. Be aware, however, that chaperones are also required to pay the full cost of the trip or raise the money on their own. An itinerary, which will give all pertinent information concerning the trip and trip regulations, will be made available to students and parents prior to the trip.

Most Frequently Asked Trip Question: *Can I pay the entire cost in February?* **Unfortunately, no.** We have to make payments every month to our tour company. If we miss payments, our trip will be cancelled.

CHOIR LETTERS

The Booster Club provides letters for any student who qualifies. A point sheet will be handed out in April for students to complete. Students can earn letter points by being in choir, auditioning for All-State, and participating in UIL Solo & Ensemble events. Students must be eligible for all events to earn letter points. Letters are awarded at the choir banquet at the end of the school year.

UIL ELIGIBILITY LAW

- → According to state law and HISD policy, each child must maintain eligibility (passing all classes with a 70% or above) to participate in any extra-curricular activity in which students are not graded. Extra-curricular activities which apply to this law are defined as:
 - Those which are UIL-sponsored events. Concert & Sightreading is no longer under this rule. However, students must pass a voice test to attend.
 - Any after-school performance or off-campus event which is not graded.
 - Any competition or contest.

Participation also means leaving BHS. An ineligible student may not attend the event as a spectator.

FUND-RAISING OPPORTUNITIES

With hard work, it is possible for every student to attend a choir trip. These fundraisers are *your* opportunity to raise money.

Bellaire High School Voice Lesson Application and Enrollment Form

The voice is an instrument and as such it is important that each individual avail himself or herself of the opportunity to learn how to use their instrument. While each Choir class will devote time to vocal development, it is highly recommended that singers study privately either through the BHS Private Lesson Program or with other teachers in Houston.

The object of the voice lesson is for students to learn good vocal technique and how their individual voice functions. Students will build a repertoire that includes art songs, arias, and some musical theater or vocal jazz. Students will also study the All-State Choir repertoire, prepare for UIL Solo & Ensemble, and explore various composers and styles appropriate for the individual. In order for the student to be successful, it is crucial that he or she practice between lessons.

All voice teachers who teach on campus are contracted by BHS Choir. Students pay choir directors directly. The fee is \$20.00 per half hour.

 Lessons are paid for in advance monthly and payment is due at the 1st of the month (\$60.00 per month = 3 lessons per month).

Each teacher will provide the students of the requirements of their studio regarding learning and preparation of music. The BHS voice teachers will teach in the Choir Practice Rooms. **All voice lesson payments will be logged on CHARMS.**

Students desiring private lessons instruction must complete a student application for enrollment, available from the choir director, and return it to the choir director. A deposit of \$60.00 will be required which shall be given to the choir director before the first lesson is given.

Lessons will be taught during the school day while in choir. Students will be assigned lesson days by the voice instructor. It is the student's responsibility to check the voice lesson schedule and plan accordingly. Some students may choose to take lessons after school, during lunch or during an off period. Please communicate schedules to voice teacher.

- It is important that the student/parent obtain all contact information from the instructor (phone, email, etc.) in the event a lesson must be missed.
 - Unexcused absences from voices lessons will be charged the full lesson price.
 - 24 hour notice of absences is required. Notification must be made to the voice lesson teacher not choir director. If less than 24 hour notice is given the student will be charged full price for the lesson.
 - Lessons will be rescheduled at the discretion of the voice teacher.
 - No refunds can be made for missed or unused voice lessons.
 - Voice teachers reserve the right to discontinue lessons at any time at their discretion.

If fees have not been paid by the second lesson of the month, the remaining lessons for that month *may* be forfeited, but payment for the entire month is still due. Students who continually pay late may become ineligible for private lessons and replaced with replaced with someone on the waiting list.

Enrollment in the voice lesson program is intended to be <u>a full-year commitment</u> by both parent (finances) and student (practice time). If a student absolutely must discontinue lessons, they must discuss it with their voice teacher and give a two-week notice to their voice teacher. Completion of an application to participate in the private voice lesson program confirms an understanding of, and agreement with, the aforementioned guidelines. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact your student's private voice teacher or choir director.
